



One Single Market: Removing legal barriers to cross-border operations



Philanthropic organisations need to be mutually recognised



No requirement to register in foreign countries



Remove restrictions when moving HQs and performing cross-border mergers within the EU



Simplify the 27 sets of rules across the EU
